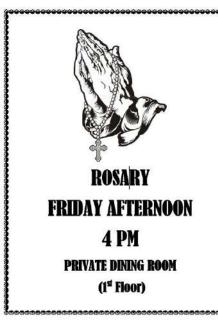


SEPTEMBER

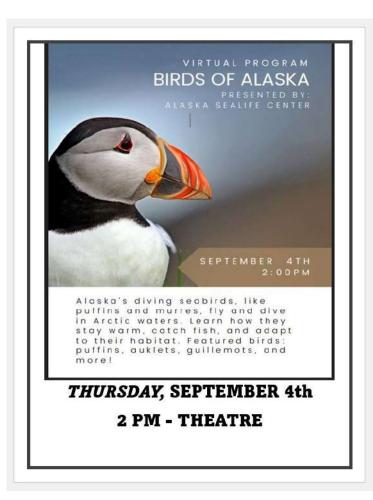
