Spring is here at Hamilton House Senior Living Community, and with it comes an important opportunity for every resident to participate in - our annual **Resident Council Election!** The Resident Council serves as our community's "local government," giving residents a strong voice in shaping daily life, activities, and community policies.

What to Know:

- **Nominations:** Residents are encouraged to run for office. Nomination forms and Nomination Box are set out on the countertop across from community mailboxes. You may submit nominations (either for yourself or for someone else – as many as you would like) up until Monday, March 30th – 3:30 PM
- **Meet the Candidates:** Candidate photos and brief introductions will be displayed on the community bulletin boards throughout April – once they are officially announced on Wednesday, April 1st – 3:30 PM – Turner Hall. Nominees will have the opportunity to accept or decline their nomination at that time.
- **Election Day:** Voting will take place on Wednesday, April 22nd from 12:30 – 2:30 PM – in 1st Floor Common Area.
- **Election Results:** Results of the Resident Council Election will be announced at the end of the April Resident Council Meeting on Wednesday, April 29th.
- The election ballots will be counted by the Community Life Director and the Executive Director – not once, but twice – with care.

Your participation - whether as a candidate or a vote - helps to ensure our Resident Council truly represents the community. Thank you for taking part in keeping Hamilton House Senior Living Community a vibrant, resident-driven place to call home.

Chaplain Corner

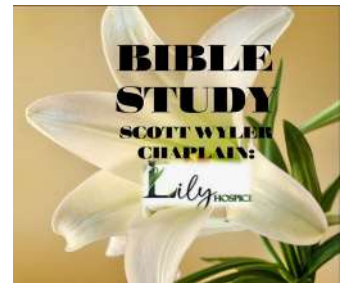
“Good humor and laughter are far too wonderful not to come straight from the heart of God.” – Beth Moore

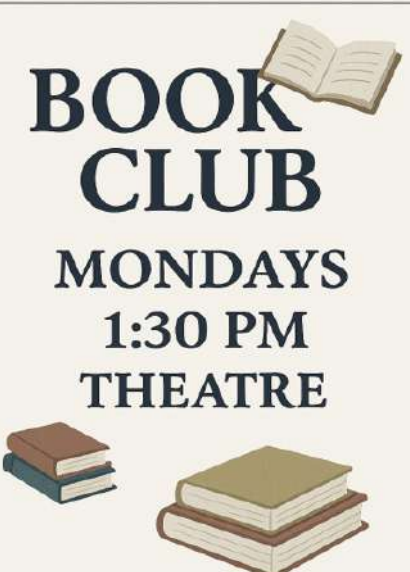

How it Works:

- The National Robot Soccer League is a brand-new competition for all communities. There are four robots that are controlled by four participants using your movements. No more complicated remote controls, just move your hand the way you want the robot to go, and it will respond. The goal is to score as many goals as possible using 36 golf balls per round (three 10-minute Rounds). You can only score one ball at a time. If more than one ball is pushed into the goal by one robot you will reset the ball on the Corner Stripe. This competition is intergenerational, however you may not at any time have more youngsters participating than elders.

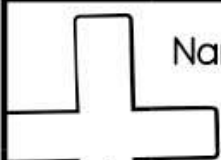

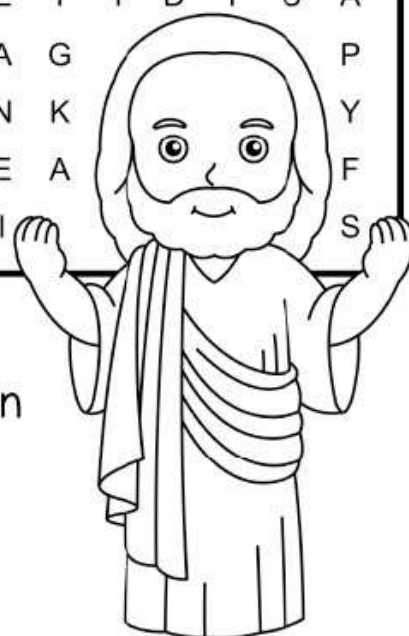
